


microchimerisms II is the second of a set of pieces exploring minute changes as a vehicle for musical development. In this piece, pitch is removed as a musical element and the timbral qualities of air sounds are explored.

Technical notes.


1. <u>No</u> pure tone or pitch (sund or played) is present in this work. All sounds are gradations of air sounds. Notes can ascend or descend relative to an arbitrary 'central' point by use of fingerings, mouth shape or other methods purely at the discretion of the performer.




2. Exhaled air is represented by square noteheads and inhaled air by triangle noteheads.




3. Mouth completely covering the embouchure hole is a dark circle, regular embouchure is a circle with a dot and completely open (no flute sound whatsoever) is a white circle.




- 4. Dynamics indicate effort and not necessarily the resultant sound.
- 5. Unvoiced vowels (indicating mouth shape only) are represented with parentheses. These should be exaggarated in order to enhance the frequency response of that mouth shape on the column of air. Voiced vowels and syllables do NOT have parentheses. These are very breathy and spoken, not sung. In general they are just frictive or plosive airy sounds such as 'sh or 'f'.



6. Vowels and syllables follow the International Phonetic Alphabet. The relevant example for each is presented beneath the syllable or consonant in small letters, with the sound in **bold and underlined**.




7. Solid slurs indicate no interruption of airflow. Dotted slurs indicate phrasing.



8. Headless notes indicate random, but musical key clicks over a 'held' note or airstream. No rearticulation is desired.

A (groan) is a voiced groan or gutteral sound, made either alone or incombination with fluttertongue.

Curved lines indicate approximate voice pitch contour (range according to performer).
